McKinney Administration is considering another company, Mountain West for next year.</li> <li>The format for the Grade 4 and 7 Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA) is going to change. Mr. O encouraged student participation in FSA's.</li> <li>A school wide writing assessment was done in the fall. Results show about 5% of students did not meet expectations, 33% are approaching expectations, 47% were fully meeting expectations and 15% were exceeding expectations at both primary and intermediate levels.</li> <li>January 29 is a district wide educational instructional day for the new curriculum.</li> <li>Saleema Noon's session went well.</li> <li>Ms. Mumford is considering ordering sex education books for the school library. She has asked if PAC would contribute towards the purchase. Some parents felt their kids would not be comfortable to borrow these books from the school library. It was decided not to contribute towards the purchase.</li> <li>Mr. Miller, band instructor is trying to buy a new drum set for the school from Tom Lee. Mr. O asked if PAC would consider splitting the cost of the drum set. All members present agreed. See the treasurer's report for a motion to use PAC funds towards the purchase.</li> <li>Basketball has started, Mr. Essex is the coach for Grade 7 boys and Ms. Green is the coach for grade 7 &amp; 6 girls.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Brenda asked if there was an interest in inviting a guest speaker to talk about RESP for children. A concern was there could be a low turnout as most parents may already have set up RESP for their kids so decided not to have the session.</li> <li>Brenda informed that McMath Secondary is going to have its parent information night for Grade 7 parents on February 4.</li> <li>Denny Ma has got permission to blog on the school website. Brenda suggested contacting him if any announcements from PAC needed to be made.</li> <li>Next PAC newsletter will be going out in February. Brenda suggested sending information to Val for the newsletter.</li> </ul>

<b>Treasurer</b> – Leanne Santha	Financial statements as on January 21, 2016 were presented by Leanne:
Santina	<ul> <li><u>General a/c:</u></li> <li>General a/c balance as on January 29, 2016 was \$24,049.36. Out of this balance \$3000 is allocated for school technology upgrade and repairs, \$1,278.90 are allocated to Eagles Nest and \$1,721.58 for playground funds. Balance of \$18,048.88 is for general expenses.</li> <li>From October 29, 2015(last PAC Meeting) to date we raised \$2,817.50. This includes \$1,187.81 from Purdy's Chocolate fund raiser, \$239.69 from pre orders for food days, \$550 from the donation drive. \$740 from cookie dough fundraiser and \$100 from clothing donation box.</li> <li>We paid \$892.50 for Saleema Noon's session, we gave \$600 donation to the DARE program, incurred expenses of \$554.81 for class room resources and office /miscellaneous expenses.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li><u>Gaming a/c:</u></li> <li>Gaming a/c balance as on January 21, 2016 was \$3,782.07.</li> <li>To date we have used these funds to pay \$1,700 for field trips and \$1,375 for Brazilian Soccer.</li> </ul>
	Mr. O said our school band teacher Mr. Miller was looking in buying new drum set for the school band. Cost of the set is around \$400. A suggestion was made to split the cost between the school and PAC i.e. \$200 each. Leanne said that PAC could use funds from Gaming a/c for this purpose.
	A motion was moved by Dora to use \$200 from gaming a/c towards the purchase of new drum set for the school. Seconded by Val. All in favour. Motion passed.
	<ul> <li><u>Playground a/c:</u></li> <li>The playground a/c balance as on January 21, 2016 was \$17,780.73. We received additional donations of \$15,000 from the following donors, Polygon Homes, G &amp; F Financial and Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans. These funds will be used for phase II of the playground upgrade.</li> </ul>
