Administrator's Report: Gordon	 District Cross Country Fun Run Taking place on October 17. Organized by Ms. Hulyk and Ms. Debou. Volleyball Organized by Ms. Debou and Ms. MacDonald. Parent/Teacher Conferences Taking place on October 18 and October 19. Students will be dismissed early, at 1:45pm. Parent/Teacher Conference are now one of five official reports in the year. In-School Field Trips Administrators are booking more in-school field trips this year, such as with Indigenous Storyteller Kung Jaadee, iLumiDance, and Drumming Workshops. In-school field trip costs are divided evenly among student population. Fees are collected via the Cash Online System; they range from \$2 to \$5. Affordability Fund is available to help support parents on the in-school field trip costs if necessary. Treasurer's Report: Eileen	 Question to Gordon whether the in-school field trips are mandatory and why are there fees? Field trips are not mandatory. In-school field trips were a way for students to see artists at work without leaving the school. Fees are subsidized through the provincial government via Art Starts fund. Some workshops in previous years have been covered by PAC. Other planned performances include a circus performance that is paid by the Core French funding from the district. Feeding Futures Fund In previous years, McKinney worked with the Food Bank to have snacks and meals available on most days to students who need it. The Feeding Futures Fund provides funds that will be used to set up a self-serve pantry with a fridge, providing perishable and non-perishable foods to students who need it.
